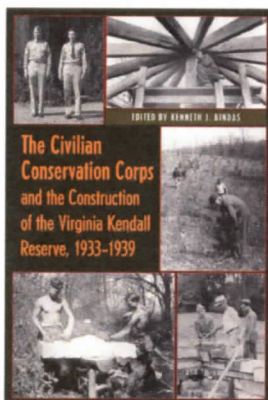




Dr. Kenneth J. Bindas, Professor & Chairperson of History at Kent State University is the editor of the recently published book, *The Civilian Conservation Corps and the Construction of the Virginia Kendall Reserve, 1933-1939*. This book tells the story of the CCC's construction of the Virginia Kendall Reserve, which today is part of the Cuyahoga Valley National Park, in Northeast Ohio.
